

Recipe Corner Beef Broth

One of my kids bought a prime rib roast with the bones in it. (May have taken out a second mortgage?)

I did this with the bones:

Into a large crock pot with bones, two chopped carrots, sweet onion, minced garlic, celery, black peppercorns and some bay leaves. Fill with water and run at low overnight. Strain and let cool before dividing into two cup freezer containers. You'll get about a gallon (16 cups).

Then:

Beef Broth Brown Gravy Ingredients:

2 cups beef broth
2 teaspoons garlic powder
1 teaspoon onion powder
1 tablespoon Worcestershire
sauce (optional)
% cup cold water + 3 tablespoons cornstarch
Salt and pepper to taste
Instructions:

Bring beef broth to a boil in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat.
Stir in garlic powder, onion powder, and Worcestershire sauce (if using).
In a small bowl, whisk together cold water and cornstarch until dissolved.
Pour cornstarch mixture into boiling beef broth and reduce heat until thickened.
