

## **Recipe Corner**


Yes, I am still using my pasta machine for egg spaghetti with sweet Italian sausage and my basil infused special sauce.


**The problem:** Farmers in Afghanistan growing poppies for the illegal drug market.

Their solution: Cash for Poppies, a \$30 million program to pay farmers \$700 an acre to destroy their crops. Turns out, you can't get paid to destroy your poppy crop if you don't have a poppy crop. Poppy cultivation exploded, with many thoughtful Afghans making sure to harvest and sell the valuable sap on the black market before destroying the remaining plants to comply with the program—getting paid twice for the same crop.

I will briefly mention the ban on the AR15 rifle the government tried when there were 400,000 "known".



The average inflation-adjusted cost of private K–12 schools in the 2019–20 school year was \$9,709 per student. In contrast, the cost for public schools was \$17,013 per student—or 75% more than private schools. The cost of public schools continues to rise (your property tax) even while some states will experience a drop of over 10% in the number of students. ACT test scores drop to lowest level in 30 years. The average scores in three of the four subjects featured on the test - mathematics, reading and science - were below the ACT College Readiness Benchmarks. The benchmarks are the minimum ACT test scores required for students taking the test to have a high probability of success in college.

The average ACT test score for students in the class of 2022 dropped to its lowest level in more than three decades 42% of students failed to meet any of the ACT's subject benchmarks in English, reading, science and math, which are minimum test scores required for students to have a reasonable chance of success in typical first-year college courses.

Homeschooled students score about 72 points higher than the national average on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT). The average American College Test (ACT) score is 21, while the 19.5 for public schools is their sixth consecutive year of declines in average scores. 85% of students are enrolled in public schools, 9.6% attend private schools, and the 5.4% for homeschooled up from 3.3% pre-Covid.
