Blue Cheese Salad Dressing

For years I've made a blue cheese dressing using a recipe that I got from a chef at the Officer's Club in Atsugi, Japan. I just discovered a new one that is simple, fast and tastes almost as good. There is no buttermilk involved which was the hardest ingredient to find for my Atsugi recipe.

- 1 1/2 cups mayonnaise
 - 1/2 cup sour cream
 - 1/4 cup vinegar
 - 4tsp sugar
 - 1/2 tsp ground mustard
 - 1/2 tsp garlic powder
 - 1/2 tsp onion powder
- Mix all together and whisk then fold in*
- 1 cup crumbled blue cheese

Cover and chill for at least two hours. Makes two cups that will last for weeks until you taste it...then it's gone.

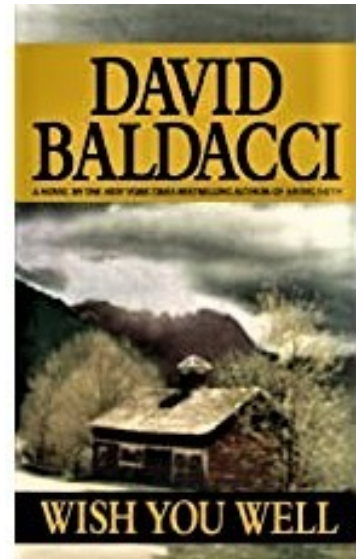

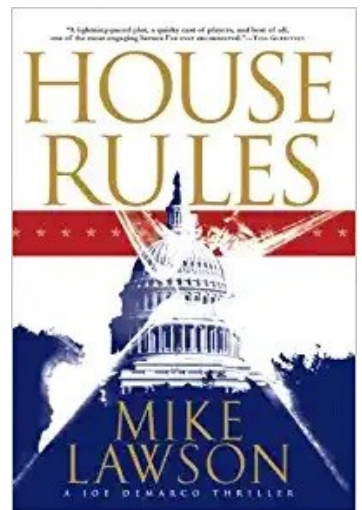
Governments establish "supreme" courts but I don't think they understand the meaning of that word.

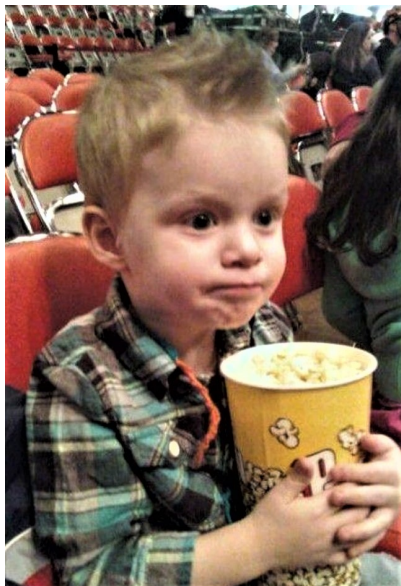
You can't handle me at my worst? Unfortunately, that's also my best.
