Standard **3triple2 bread** at top but I cut the second batch of dough into eight pieces and used 2 cup Pyrex dishes to make rolls. Very similar to rolls I had in the Azores (*Portugal*) crunchy on the outside and chewy on the inside. New oven is fantastic with even heat and convection baking. Let me know if you want to try and I'll send recipe and suggested steps to make them. You can freeze them and heat them up in a toaster oven with very little loss of crunch or chewiness!

Bonus Recipe...Panfish fillets marinated in Italian salad dressing for couple of hours and then fried over medium heat of my new gas stove with the marinade...sprinkle lemon juice last minute of the about five it takes. Really good with Sauvignon Blanc and the rolls

Should have used the trans argument?



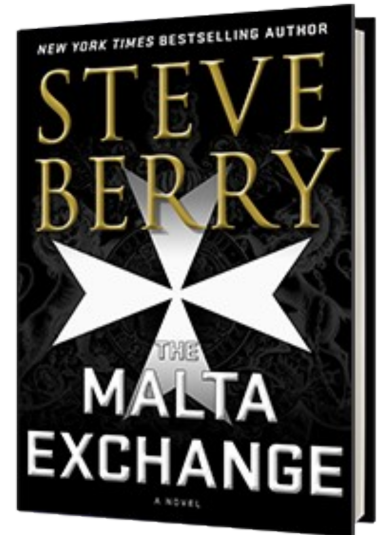

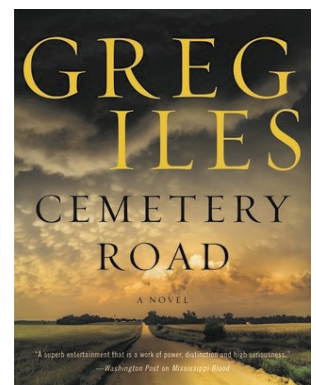
