Recipe Corner Breakfast Stuff

Yeah...that's me. I start every day with a smoothie containing English walnuts, banana, kiwi, pineapple chunks, strawberries, blueberries, two kinds of raspberries, yogurt, chia seeds and a bottle of Ensure protein drink. I drink it with a handful of vitamins. That gets me through the entire day until dinner at which time I always do something different. However, I did run across this after searching for apple recipes:

Apple Pie Breakfast Ingredients

- 1 cup of steel cut oats* - 3 diced apples

- 1 cup apple juice
- 3 cups water
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon

Directions

Combine all ingredients in slow cooker and cook for 2-4 hours on high or 4-6 hours on low until it reaches the consistency that you like. Be sure to stir every hour or so.

It must be steel cut oats when cooked in the slow cooker, as regular oats get too soggy when cooked this way. You can find steel cut oats in most grocery stores sometimes called "irish oats".

Yes, I tried it and it's great. (I own four slow cookers.)





Dr. Jack Devere Minzey (1928-2018) was the Department Head of Education at Eastern Michigan University as well as a prolific author. One of his final books contained this:

Two or more sides disagree on who runs the country. And they can't settle the question through elections because they don't even agree that elections are how you decide who's in charge. That's the basic issue here. Who decides who runs the country? When you hate each other but accept the election results, you have a country. When you stop accepting election results, you have a countdown to a civil war. This isn't dissent. It's not disagreement. You can hate the other party. You can think they're the worst thing that ever happened to the country. But then you work harder to win the next election. When you consistently reject the results of elections that you don't win, what you want is a dictatorship. The only legitimate exercise of power in this country, according to Democrats, is its own.

Whenever Republicans exercise power, it's inherently illegitimate. The Democrats lost Congress. They lost the White House. So what did they do? They began trying to run the country through Federal judges and bureaucrats. Every time that a Federal judge issues an order saying that the President of the United States can't scratch his own back without his say so, that's the civil war. Donald Trump

has caused the Shadow Government to come out of hiding: Professional government is a guild. Like medieval guilds. You can't serve in if you're not a member. If you haven't been indoctrinated into its arcane rituals. If you aren't in the club. And Trump isn't in the club. He brought
