

## Recipe Corner Fresh Fish Fillets

Son Chris's fishing exploits extend into winter so I've got supply of panfish fillets. So glad I taught him how to fillet...so I don't have to. I use crushed Ritz crackers, flour, baking powder for coating. Use an egg and Agave\* syrup rather than honey to coat them before using the dry ingredients. Then fried in 1/4 inch vegetable oil for a crisp coating. Pair with a baked potato, salad and, of course, any white wine. \*Agave is the plant they use to make Tequila...hard to find but worth the search...the syrup, not the tequila.


Next week, facts about Floyd's death will be on the record as opposed to the Lame Stream Media versions. Last week, the MPLS council approved \$1,181,500 for communication with the community during the trial. The city says social media partners will help dispel potential misinformation, and that the influencers will intentionally target Black, Native American, Somali, Hmong and Latinx communities with their messaging. 

Fauci is an excellent politician who has survived four decades and five presidents — two Democrats, and three Republicans. Considering the mental acuity of the country's assumed president, and the ongoing anxiety among its citizens, it appears the politically skilled but scientifically inept Fauci is not going anywhere.

In January 2020 Dr. Anthony Fauci told Newsmax TV that the United States "did not have to worry" about the coronavirus and that it was "not a major threat." Fauci warned of an apocalyptic coronavirus pandemic — then just weeks later he later compared the coronavirus to a bad flu. Dr. Fauci based all of his predictions on garbage IHME models that were OFF BY MILLIONS and then told reporters, "You can't really rely on models." Dr. Fauci claimed 1 million to 2 million Americans would die from coronavirus. Then he said 100,000 to 200,000 Americans will die from the virus. Then he agreed 81,766 Americans would die from the coronavirus. Then the experts cut the number of deaths to 60,415 projected deaths.

March 2020 Dr. Fauci jumped in and "corrected" the president during a press briefing on hydroxychloroquine treatment for coronavirus saying, "You got to be careful when you say 'fairly effective.' It was never done in a clinical trial... It was given to individuals and felt that maybe it worked." Exactly two weeks later hydroxychloroquine was deemed the most highly rated treatment for the novel coronavirus in an international poll of more than 6,000 doctors.

Dr. Fauci said President Trump should have shut down the economy in February 2020. (*The president was a bit pre-occupied with the Democrat impeachment sham*). Then Fauci told the TODAY Show on February 29 that you don't need to "change anything you're doing."


Dr. Anthony Fauci's National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) redirected \$117 million from infectious diseases to fund a new anthrax vaccine effort in response to the anthrax attacks that happened a week after 9/11. The millions were just a small part of the \$1.8 billion Fauci had poured into defense from bioterrorist attacks over the preceding two years. More than half of those funds were devoted to anthrax and smallpox alone. In 2004, Fauci launched the \$5.6 billion "Project Bioshield," the National Institutes of Health's biggest outlay for a single research issue until then. In 2007, after spending billions under the opposite premise, Fauci admitted that "at the end of the day, you're not going to kill as many people [with an anthrax attack] as you would if you blasted off a couple of car bombs in Times Square."

The anthrax vaccine failure followed on the heels of Fauci's controversial leadership of the nation's AIDS response in the 1980s and '90s. Fauci started his career as "a lackluster scientist," who "found his true vocation—empire building" when he took the reins at NIAID in 1984. ("**Good Intentions**," a 1990 book by investigative author and innovation expert Bruce Nussbaum).

To ensure that AIDS would be his exclusive demesne within the federal government, Fauci "started the most important bureaucratic battle in the history of the fight against AIDS," squeezing out more scientifically competent, but less conniving administrators. Having won his monopoly over AIDS within the federal government, Fauci, by training an immunologist who focuses on how the body fights infections itself, favored a vaccine approach in the fight against the then-terminal illness. This understandable professional bias came at the expense of research into the anti-retroviral drugs that ultimately reduced AIDS from a death sentence to a chronic disease in remission.
