


No...not a household tip.

Fox firing Tucker Carlson sets up your free six pack of Bud Light with your Fox subscription renewal.





In 2018, seven late night programs - NBC's "Tonight" and "Late Night," CBS' "Late Show" and "Late Late Show," ABC's "Jimmy Kimmel Live," Comedy Central's "Daily Show" and NBC's "Saturday Night Live" — drew more than \$698 million in advertising in 2018, according to Vivvix, a tracker of ad spending.
