

State transportation revenues currently come from three sources: the gas tax, vehicle registration fees (tabs), and the Motor Vehicle Sales Tax. The average annual per capita use of gas in Minnesota is 528 gallons. The population of Minnesota is 5.7 million. The excise tax on gasoline in Minnesota is 28.6 cents per gallon not counting the additional 18.4 federal gas tax and 24.4 on diesel. That comes to \$151.1 per capita annually raised in Minnesota from a MN tax. Gov Timmy wants an additional 20 cent gas tax to fund an \$8 billion ten year plan...the math says he will be getting almost twice that in the same period without raising taxes.

- 1. Minnesota gas tax annually = \$861,270,000.00
- 2. Vehicle registration fees annually = \$490,000,000.00
- 3. MVST annually = \$390,000,000.00

TOTAL: \$1,741,127,000.00 annually from MN vehicle taxes

This figure does NOT include any federal funding for transportation. The 18.4 cents per gallon federal tax totals \$98.00 per capita for another \$558,600,000.00 paid by MN drivers as a tax on gasoline.

\$2,299,727,000.00 currently paid annually by MN drivers.

There ya go Timmy...no need for raising the gas tax. And we haven't even included the 28.5 cents diesel tax paid by the 3,028,038 trucks in MN.

You're already collecting enough to fund your ten year plan.

BTW: MN spent \$93 million on a computer system that totally crashed and they had to do it all over. After investing nine years and \$93 million implementing a new licensing and registration system for the Driver and Vehicle Services...a Colorado-based IT company contracted by the state to handle the implementation of the MNLARS driver's license program—for a fee of \$26 million. MNLARS Project Director Paul Meekin was fired and paid \$43,000.00 if he would promise not to sue them. The license renewal charge was then adjusted to include a \$2.25 "technology surcharge". Way to go Timmy!!!
