Recipe Corner Bourbon Whiskey BBQ Sauce Ingredients:

1/2 onion, minced
4 cloves garlic, minced
3/4 cup bourbon whiskey
1/2 t ground pepper
1/2 T salt
2 cups ketchup
1/4 cup tomato paste
1/3 cup cider vinegar
2 T liquid smoke
1/4 cup Worcestershire sauce
1/2 cup packed brown sugar
1/3 t hot pepper sauce

In a large skillet over medium heat, combine the onion, garlic, and whiskey. Simmer for 10 minutes, or until onion is translucent. Mix in the ground black pepper, salt, ketchup, tomato paste, vinegar, liquid smoke, Worcestershire sauce, brown sugar, and hot pepper sauce. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium-low, and simmer for 20 minutes. Run sauce through a strainer if you prefer a smooth sauce. BTW: Sam's Club had four pound chickens on sale for 99cents/lb. 








Book Report
