


Recipe Corner Baked Shrimp Wild Rice Ingredients

8-ounce wild rice
1 pound cooked shrimp
2 tablespoons butter
1/2 onion, chopped
cream of mushroom soup, 10
3/4-ounce cans
2 cups grated sharp Cheddar
more mushrooms
salt and pepper

Instructions

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F.
Cook the rice. Drain and cool.
Heat butter in saucepan and sauté the onion until soft, about 5 minutes. In a large bowl, combine the rice, soup, 1 1/2 cups of cheese, shrimp and onion. Add salt and pepper, to taste and mix well.
Spray a 11 by 7-inch glass casserole dish with non-stick spray. Spread the mixture in the dish and top with 1/2 cup cheese. Bake for 30 minutes.


