400 Years of Resistance and Liberation
Remembering, Recovering, Reimagining
Sacred Conversations with City Staff

This year marks the 400 Year Commemoration of African people being brought to Jamestown, VA by the British and forced into slavery. While Africans had been enslaved in the Americas prior to this date, this commemoration gives us an opportunity to reflect on the lasting impact of this event, as well as to honor the legacy of resistance and liberation of African American people.

Led by the City's Racial Equity Coordinators, Sacred Conversations will give an opportunity for staff to discuss how they relate to the enslavement, resistance, and continual push for liberation for African American people. Come take part in the conversation to have a better understanding of our role as City staff. Each session will address the theme for this work of remembering who we are (May), recovering our narratives of oppression and liberation (June), and re-imagining a future without harm (July).

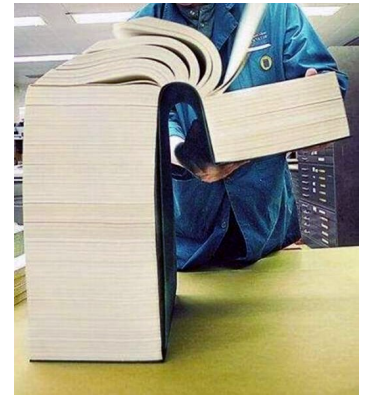

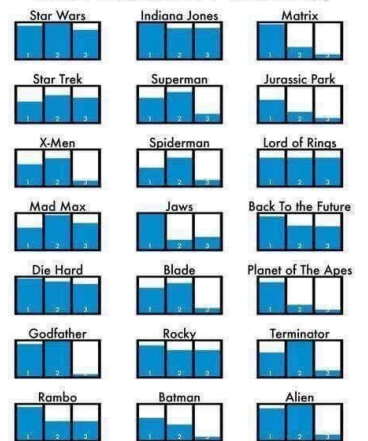

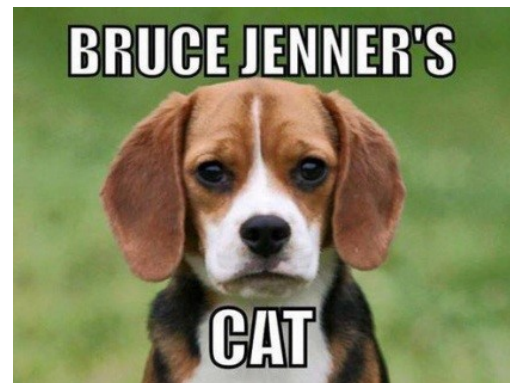
