BTW: Since 1961 Minneapolis has had ONE Republican mayor, Richard Erdall, who served for ONE year in 1974.

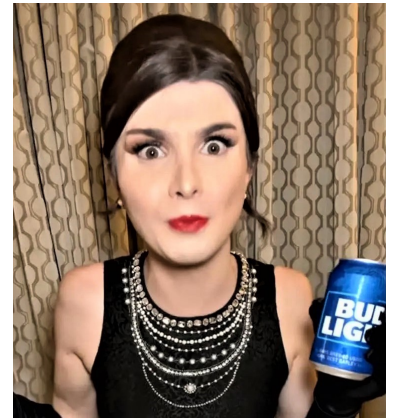
**Hmmm...**
