

# Recipe Corner Taco Salad




As a famous CA gov once said: "Government's view of the economy could be summed up in a few short phrases,"

CA Gov has been recalled with a porn star among those running to replace him. You can't make this stuff up.




## **Book Report**

His literary offerings gains the force of prophecy for America today as he revealed the evil of Soviet Communism in the most powerful literary works of the 20th century. *The following quotes are scary when you compare them to the current political scene:* 

"We know they are lying, they know they are lying, they know we know they are lying, we know they know we know they are lying, but they are still lying."

"Hastiness and superficiality are the psychic diseases of the 20th century, and more than anywhere else this disease is reflected in the press."
