

## Recipe Corner Uncle Leo Potatoes

One large baking potato cut into small cubes. Medium sweet onion cut into bits Sweet peppers cut into strips Soak potato cubes and onion bits in lightly salted water. Skillet with couple TB oil to medium heat. Potatoes and onion fried half way done (about 15 minutes) then add sweet peppers. Continue low heat for about another 20 minutes until potatoes are browned. There will be lots of steam so do not cover. Pepper and other spices to taste. (Roselee's Uncle taught us how to make these.)



Once done they go good with baked walleye fillets, homemade bread and bottle of Liebfraumilch.







Good story but can't see this going beyond the first book about the hero.




Confusing plot jumping all over four generations in a depressing story BUT it's one of the best use of the English language in any book I've ever read.
