

Recipe Corner Perfect Mashed Potatoes

Previous newsletter provided the Shepard Pie recipe (I can send upon request) that used mashed potatoes as topping. Here're the tips: Use peeled baking potatoes cut in chunks. Boil in salt water at low setting until they fall apart. Drain water and place pan back on stove to eliminate as much moisture as possible. Drop in garlic buds, butter, sour cream and half' 'n half. Heat until butter melts. Then use hand held mixer to break up the chunks before turning it on. Mix until no more chunks. Make it gooder by folding in beaten egg. Then into a casserole dish; brush melted butter on top and sprinkle sweet (also called Hungarian) paprika. In the oven at 350° for about 20 minutes; browned on top. 
